## City of Durand

### MILLAGE TO SUBSIDIZE FIRE AND AMBULANCE SERVICES

Shall the City of Durand assess and collect 1.65 mills (\$1.65 per \$1,000 of Taxable Value) for a period of 10 years that being fiscal years 2020-21 through 2029-30 inclusive for the purpose of using the money to subsidize ambulance and fire services for the entire city?

The City estimates that it will collect \$104,647.40 in the first fiscal year if this proposal is approved.

## City of Owosso

### CITY OF OWOSSO BOND PROPOSAL FOR STREET IMPROVEMENTS

Shall the City of Owosso, Shiawassee County, Michigan, borrow the principal sum of not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor in one or more series, payable in not to exceed twenty years from the date of issue of each series, for the purpose of paying the costs to the City of acquiring and constructing local and major street improvements in the City consisting of paving, repaving, reconstructing and improving streets, sidewalks, parking areas, and all necessary appurtenances and attachments thereto for the use of the City? The estimated millage to be levied in 2021 is 2.5689 mills (\$2.5689 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and the estimated simple average annual millage rate required to retire the bonds is 2.9831 mills (\$2.9831 per \$1,000 of taxable value).

## **New Haven Township**

### NEW HAVEN TOWNSHIP BALLOT PROPOSAL

Shall New Haven Township levy up to 1/3 of a mill (.333 cents per \$1,000.00 taxable value of real property) each year on an ad valorem basis, for a term of four (4) years (2020, 2021, 2022, 2023)? Such millage to be used to provide funding to the Shiawassee Area Transportation Agency (SATA) so that Township residents can ride public transportation at a reduced charge.

It is estimated that the Township will receive up to \$15,497.00 the first year if the millage is Approved.

## **Chesaning Union Schools**

### CHESANING UNION SCHOOLS SINKING FUND MILLAGE PROPOSAL

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Chesaning Union Schools, Saginaw and Shiawassee Counties, Michigan, be increased by and the board of education be authorized to levy not to exceed .75 mill (\$.75 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 5 years, 2020 to 2024, inclusive, to create a sinking fund for the construction or repair of school buildings, for school security improvements, for the acquisition or upgrading of technology and all other purposes authorized by law; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2020 is approximately \$244,000?

# **Ingham Intermediate School District**

INGHAM INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT  
SPECIAL EDUCATION MILLAGE PROPOSAL  
(RESTORATION OF HEADLEE REDUCTION)

This proposal requests additional millage to permit the continued levy by the intermediate school district of the maximum mills for special education previously approved by the electors.

Shall the current charter limitation on the annual property tax rate for the education of students with a disability in Ingham Intermediate School District, Michigan, be increased by 0.2438 mill (\$0.2438 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 20 years, 2020 to 2039, inclusive (this increase will allow the intermediate school district to levy the maximum rate of 4.75 mills previously approved by the electors that has been reduced as required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963); the estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2020 is approximately \$2,300,000 from local property taxes authorized herein?
