Once the probation department has looked at this form, it will be given to the judge before the defendant/juvenile is sentenced. But you do need to know that this form will probably also be given to the defendant/juvenile and his lawyer before the sentencing.

Please write or draw anything you want the judge to know about how you feel because of what happened to you. You can write or draw to talk about anything that has changed in your life or in your family. You can tell a story, write a poem, or whatever you think would best tell the judge how you feel about what happened.
